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Sin: Our Thirst for the Worst

What in the world is wrong with us?

That is our question for this issue of "The Basic Good New." Any newspaper on any day of any year will tell us something is wrong. What is it? The simple answer

given to us by God is "sin." There is evil and tragedy and death in the world because of us, because of our sin.

The news this time

seems anything but good. It is news about the reality of sin and evil and death. The Good News is that God has overcome our wrong by His love in Jesus Christ, but we cannot understand, appreciate, accept and celebrate God's grace until we come to terms with the

bad news of sin.

What is sin? It is, fundamentally, a rejection of God, His truth, His goodness, His love. It is expressed in our habitual failure to do what God says to do and our natural desire and vain attempt to live

> according to our own delusion of reasonable wisdom and adequate health apart from God.

And the result of sin? ALIENATION. It separates us from God. It separates us from one another. When we choose to live apart from God,

the Bible says, He lets us. Rather than overwhelming us by His power and making us behave ourselves according to His will and in spite of our own, God honors our humanity, our free will. He gives us over to our foolishness. So by our experience of futility in sin we ought to come running back to God, but we don't. Sin has corrupted us too completely.

Sin is a brokenness that is part of our basic nature since the time of our most ancient ancestor. Adam. And it is our own choice to do what is wrong-in thought, word and deed-again and again and again.

Sin is a pervasive reality for the whole human race. We ignore it to our continual and eternal peril. It is also an inescapable personal responsibility. I can't blame God or anyone else for my own choice to turn away from what is right, away from the Living God, and to embrace evil instead. The great Christian writer of last century, G.K. Chesterton, was asked by the London Times to offer an essay in response to the question "What is wrong with the world?" Chesterton's reply contained only two words: "I am."

Why Does the "S" Word Make People So Angry?

"Sin" is a word that stirs people up these days. Have you noticed? "Don't use that word around my children, please!... Hey, what's the matter with you? That word went out with the Inquisition!..."

People in our culture really don't like the "S" word. It's as though the word itself was dirty rather than a broadly apt and essential way of expressing the dirty realities of our broken world. Why the anger?...

I suppose nobody likes to hear bad news, and nobody wants to admit that things with them,

with us, are out of kilter. But beyond this, I think the concept of sin conflicts with one of the fundamental assumptions of our culture, the notion that we human beings are basically good folks. Since before Protagoras the Greek said it some 2500 years ago, we have been attracted to the idea that "Man is the measure of all things." It doesn't get any better than us! We are taught that whatever problems we might have, we can over come them all with some additional learning and some extra effort. We want to believe that all those bad people we hear about on the news are the exception to the rule and we are part of the basically-good-or-at-least-well-intentioned ma-

So, when

somebody uses the "S" word, people in our culture think they're being unnecessarily negative. But the Bible says they're being necessarily honest. And the Bible is God's inspired message to humanity. And God is the real "measure of all things."

And here's the real tragedy of our modern overoptimism about ourselves: Such a view prevents us from hearing and accepting the Good News of God's grace in all its fullness.

Romans 1:18-32 — An Horrific Picture, Humanity in Sin

God's Wrath Against Mankind

¹⁸ The wrath of God is being revealed from heaven against all the godlessness and wickedness of men who suppress the truth by their wickedness, ¹⁹ since what may be known about God is plain to them, because God has made it plain to them. ²⁰ For since the creation of

the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from

what has been made, so that men are without excuse.

²¹ For although they knew God, they neither glorified him as God nor gave thanks to him, but their thinking became futile and their foolish hearts were darkened.
²² Although they claimed to be wise, they became fools ²³ and exchanged the glory of the immortal

God for images made to look like mortal man and birds and animals and reptiles.

²⁴ Therefore God gave them over in the sinful desires of their hearts to sexual impurity for the degrading of their bodies with one another. ²⁵ They exchanged the truth of God for a lie, and

worshiped and served created things rather than the Creator who is forever praised. Amen.

the sinful desires of their hearts..."

26 Because of this, God gave them over to shameful lusts. Even their women exchanged natural relations for unnatural ones. 27 In the same way the men also abandoned natural relations with women and were inflamed with lust for one another. Men committed indecent acts with other men, and received in themselves the due penalty for their perversion.

²⁸ Furthermore, since they did not think it worthwhile to retain the knowledge of God, he gave them over to a depraved mind, to do what ought not to be done.

²⁹ They have become filled with every kind of wickedness, evil, greed and depravity. They are full of envy, murder, strife, deceit and malice. They are

gossips, ³⁰ slanderers, God-haters, insolent, arrogant and boastful; they invent ways of doing evil; they disobey their parents; ³¹ they are senseless, faithless, heartless, ruthless. ³² Although they know God's righteous decree that those who do such things deserve death, they not only continue to do these very things but also approve of those who practice them.

Questions to Ask:

- 1. Against what is God's wrath directed? Why do you suppose God reacts this way?
- 2. How do human beings actively rebel against God? How does God respond to this?
- 3. What qualities characterize humanity living in rebellion against God? What evidence do you see of these things in people today?



Romans 3:23 — A Universal Calamity

²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God...

Questions to Ask:

1. How does this verse conflict with modern ideas of what it means to be human?

2. Whom does it say is affected by the reality of sin?



Romans 6:23 — Sin's Deadly Consequence

²³ For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Questions to Ask: 1. What do we earn by our sin? What are its "wages?"

- 2. What is the difference between a wage and a gift?
- 3. What is the "gift" God gives?

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Isaiah 53:6 — Humanity in Sin, Going Our Own Way

6 We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

Questions to ask:

- 1. What does the Prophet say our problem is?
- 2. What is the Lord's response? Who is "him?"


Genesis 3 — The Great & First Tragedy, Paradise Lost

The Fall of Man

3 Now the serpent was more crafty


10 He answered, "I heard you in the garden, and I was afraid because I was


Ephesians 2:1-3 — Human Nature, Dead in Sin

2 As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, 2 in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. 3 All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our sinful nature and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature objects of wrath.

Questions to ask: 1. What does it mean to be dead? What can a dead person do for himself?

2. Whom and what do sinful people tend to follow? What do they live to do? What do they earn by this behavior?
