Misery:

God created a good and perfect world and placed our oldest ancestors, made in His image and the capstone of His good Creation, in it... They rebelled, they sinned, foolishly trying to take God's place in their world, and all Creation "Fell" into a state of gross imperfection—the Curse of Death and Corruption became a reality. Mankind, every one of us since that time, has shown our utter inability and unwillingness fundamentally to change this situation, to reconcile ourselves to God, to restore life-giving goodness. Redemption:
