A Portrait of Pride from Esther 1

- 3. Pride Disrespects & Dehumanizes Others, Turning People into Trophies.
- 4. Pride Condemns All Pride but Its Own.
- 5. Pride Makes Your Concerns of No Concern and My Concerns Everybody's Concern
- 6. Pride Disrespects Its Possessor, Making Him/Her the Biggest Fool of All.
- 7. Pride, Despite Being Essentially Anti-God, Is Nevertheless a Powerful Tool Used by God for the Accomplishing of His Purposes.
