The Real Pageant: God's Beauty on Display (Esther 2)

- 1. The great beauty pageant is divised as a remedy for kingly regret.
 - ⇒ Even the Unholy Distractions of Men Serve the Holy Purposes of God. (*BEAUTIFUL*!)
- 2. Mordecai adopts his orphaned cousin, Hadassah/Esther.
 - ⇒ Our Little Acts of Normal-Life Goodness Also May Provide the Building Blocks for God's Great Acts Of Extraordinary Blessing. (*BEAUTIFUL*!)
- 3. Esther is forced to relocate & remain at the royal residence.
 - ⇒ The Will of Malevolent Man Can Only Be Excercised Under the Benevolent Will of God. (*BEAUTIFUL!*)
- 4. The Competition: 400-1,000 carefully selected & abundantly resourced maidens... Only One will be queen: The rest become nameless, powerless harem girls.
 - ⇒ There Are No Odds with God. (*BEAUTIFUL!*)
- 5. Esther heeds the advice of cousin Mordecai & of Hegai the eunuch.
 - ⇒ Gracious Humility (A Teachable Spirit), Ultimarely Under God, Beautifies Its Wearer in a Way No Perfume or Jewelry can Enhance. (*BEAUTIFUL!*)
- 6. Mordecai's good deed is recorded but completely unacknowledged.
 - ⇒ Our Works (Good or Evil) Are Best Seen <u>Under</u> the Timeless Sky of God's Patience Rather than <u>In</u> the Fading Fireworks of Our Efforts. (BEAUTIFUL!)
