

Arriving at Kadesh-Barnea, the Israelites had reached the southern border of Canaan as defined in Numbers 34:4. They will very shortly enter the promised land. At God's

command a man from each tribe is sent out to spy out the land. They return with a glowing account of its wealth and fertility, but claim it will be impossible to conquer. This of course is a direct contradiction of the age-old promise of Abraham that his descendants would inherit the land, and a denial of the whole purpose of the exodus from Egypt. Indeed they say "Let us choose a leader and go back to Egypt" (14:4).


Prayers of the People & the Lord's Prayer
