Restoration: Easter to Pentecost #3
(John 21:1-25)

When we hear "Follow Me" from Jesus, we are hearing the effective call to Life from the Restorer, the Redeemer, the Reorienter.

I. Restored vv. 1-14

A. To Divine Partnership (Another Catch of Fish)

vv.1-8

- 1. With a Savior who acts (Jesus' power is great and for sharing).
- 2. In work we do *for* Jesus (which is always work we do *with* Jesus).
- B. To a Real Friendship (Another Meal with Jesus) vv.9-14

II. Redeemed vv.15-19

- A. From Shameful, Faithless Cowardice (Another Charcoal Fire)
- B. To Courageous, Faithful Service & Honor (A 2nd Chance to Die)

III. Reoriented vv.20-25

- A. To Christocentricity (Jesus at the Center)
 - 1. Vertical rather than Horizontal perspective
 - 2. Submission to Jesus (Follow Me!) rather than Elevation of Self
- **B.** For Revolutionary Action (the world turning right-side-up)
 - 1. Peter the missionary martyr with Jesus ...
 - 2. John the "beloved disciple," writer & visionary with Jesus...
 - 3. God's ongoing work of life-giving Restoration
