1 Can we test out the mic? Is it working? Yes. Okay. Sorry guys, I forgot to go 2 3 get, I forgot to get mic. Ah, here we go. 4 Oh, does 5 anybody need a Bible?All 6 right, so first, I want to 7 say thank you to Jay. 8 I recognize 9 theSignificance of standing behind this 10 pulpit. Me out in the hall starting off 11 my thoughts and opinions is one thing, 12 but I do recognize that standing behind 13 here has a different significance. So So 14 I just want to thank you for the 15 opportunity to speak. My gift is not 16 preaching. It's teaching, 17 and that's kind of what we'll do today. 18 I've always wondered. especially when I 19 was in high school and college, when I 20 never really got called to preach. And 21 then I've listened to myself a few times. 22 And when I start preaching, I get kind of 23 judgy. I get to be a bit of a 24 know-it-all. I get quite opinionated. 25 So I'm going to try not to do that 26 today. And this is more 27 teaching than it is preaching. So 28 hopefully, you'll find it helpful. 29 When JayCalled me up a few 30 months ago and says, hey, I'd like for 31 you to speak and we're doing this series 32 and I don't know if he said this or if he 33 said something that made me think this, 34 but it was really about creating a 35 picture of Jesus, right? 36 So you know, I'd like you to get up and 37 we're having different people kind of 38 talk about different pictures of Jesus 39 and immediately I knew which verse I 40 was going to do. In fact, even suggested 41 I'm like, actually I was thinking about 42 that first. That's exactly what I was 43 thinking about, two different ones and 44 and that was the one I kind of wanted to 45 go with. UmAnd I think that's important 46 for how we do mental 47 models, right? The model that you have of God 48 49 and of Jesus influences the way you 50 pray, the way that you treat other 51 people, the things that you do in your 52 life, the things that you think are 53 important. And we all 54 create these models in our head, right?We 55 all do. We all create a God, little 56 G, a God that's in our minds, 57 and this God agrees with how 58 we think about stuff, right?Well, he 59 does, right?But even if it's a negative 60 thing. So do you have a God that's like a 61 taskmaster, and he's like, da-da-da, 62 because that's how you think, and 63 therefore, maybe you're always under 64 guilt. Or maybe you think you've got a 65 God that his job there is to spew 66 blessings and gifts, so therefore, God, 67 please help me do this, and please help 68 me do that. Why didn't God help me do 69 this?Whatever that mental picture is of

70 God, it influences everything 71 about you. So that's why it's important 72 to have a, and we all do it, right?That's 73 why it's important to have a a very 74 biblically-based view of Jesus, and he's 75 very multifaceted, and I'm gonna hit one 76 of those today. And I'm 77 gonna show you from the Bible. So 78 as as Jay said, I don't have a 79 lot of content today. I wanna talk, I'm 80 gonna make a few points. I'll do a couple 81 analogies to kind of help you think about 82 stuff. But we're gonna do a lot of going 83 through this. So in 84 your bulletins, I've gone through, 85 because I know everybody doesn't know the 86 order of all the books in the Bible, you weren't raised Southern Baptist doing 87 88 Bible drills like me. So you may not know 89 that. So at least for these black ones, 90 the page numbers are actually in there, 91 so that you can kind of look these up. 92 And honestly, my my only 93 fear today is going too long, so we may 94 skip over a few as I'm watching the 95 clock, as I'm watching it right now. So a 96 lot of these are going to be familiar 97 with you, and that's the reason why I've 98 picked a lot of these, right?Because you 99 will know these, but you may not think 100 about them the way that you thought about 101 them today. So does anybody need one, 102 by the way? And if anybody doesn't have 103 one, just look over your neighbor and say SOS. I scoot over some, right, so I can I 104 105 can share yours. My daughter 106 doesn't have one. 107 You're welcome. 108 whatever she wants. 109 And by the way, my grandson is here 110 today, so. So if he if 111 he starts speaking up, it's okay by me, I 112 guess. All right, okay, so quickly. 113 So, I'm gonna start with the premise. And 114 this is my opinion. I'll try to make sure 115 I point out one of the things are my 116 opinion versus things that I think are in 117 the scripture. um But 118 something has to be self-existent. And 119 what does that self-existent mean? 120 Something's had to always exist. And my 121 opinion is that it takes less faith to 122 believe that. Now there's some other 123 faith that takes later on, but to 124 understand that something had to come 125 from something, and that when you follow 126 that train all the way back to its 127 logical beginning, something has to 128 have always existed, otherwise nothing 129 would exist. And the scientists, they try 130 to come up with these really contorted 131 ways of figuring that out. But that's 132 what I've come to realize is that 133 something, now, once you've agreed on 134 that point, there's a lot of debate as to 135 what that is, right?And there's lots of 136 opinions, and that's where faith can come 137 in. But for me, it's less faith to think 138 some entity has to have always existed,

139 and that's what brought forth the stuff 140 that we do know and we do see. 141 AndToday's culture, they they try to 142 skirt that, if you think about it, right? 143 A lot of people really do believe that, even if they don't want to say they're 144 Christians, or Lord forbid, even 145 146 religious, right?But they'll say things 147 like, well, the universe is trying to 148 tell me something, right?Or I'm just 149 going to throw it out to the universe, 150 right?Because everybody has this 151 thing inside them that that says, well, 152 something's got to be there. And then we 153 fight wars and we debate and we argue. We 154 kill people over what that entity is, 155 right?But that's that's kind of the 156 starting point, is that premise. I'm not 157 gonna go through that middle part, 158 right?I'm sure that we're all gonna be 159 able to agree that that our faith is is 160 that Jehovah, Yahweh, 161 Jesus Christ is that entity. And that's 162 what I want to talk about today. So first, let's open up our Bibles to 163 164 13 through 14, it's page 46, if you've 165 got the blue ones, I'm sorry, the black 166 ones, the blue ones I saw, they may have 167 different page numbers. So the 168 the context of this verse is that Moses 169 has, he's out in the wilderness, he sees 170 this burning bush, and God's talking to 171 him and telling him, Hey, I want you to 172 go back into Egypt and let my 173 people go, right?And so then Moses says to God, If I come to the people of Israel 174 175 and say to them, The God of your fathers 176 has sent me to you, and they ask me, What 177 is his name?What should y'all say to them? 178 And God said to Moses, I am who I am. 179 And he said, Say to the 180 people, I am has sent 181 me to you. 182 When I was younger, in high school, 183 college, right, I always thought that was 184 a weird name, I am. 185 But then I started thinking through, as I 186 got older, and I started reading science 187 books and just articles. Andand starting 188 to understand and really contemplating, 189 okay, what what is the beginning, 190 right?Where does everything come from? 191 1, right?Where does that all come from? 192 I realize that that's exactly what God 193 tells us right there. Some things have to 194 always exist. And he says it right there. 195 It's in his name. Yahweh 196 is the tetragram for I am. And 197 in our Bibles, our English Bibles, we 198 don't ever see the word Yahweh, we see 199 the word in small caps called Lord, but 200 that's where they've translated it out of 201 the Hebrew, into English, because 202 out of respect for the name, right?But 203 that's what his name means. When we 204 say Lord, we mean Yahweh, and we 205 mean the self-existent one. It's in his 206 name. And when you think about that, 207 actually this isn't in the, this is a

208 bonus one, right, when you think about 209 that, Psalms 9 210 says that the Lord, Yahweh, 211 the Lord is a refuge for the oppressed, a 212 stronghold for troubles. 213 Those who know His name trust in Him. 214 Well, how can that be?If you know 215 that the name of God is this 216 self-existent entity that 217 allows you, that helps you trust in Him. 218 That's the significance of that verse, 219 right, that name, right?All right, so 220 56 and 58, 221 page 895. This is actually the 222 text that this is centered on. I'll give 223 you a little bit of background, but I'll 224 go really fast. So this is an argument that's kinda taking place between Jesus 225 226 and the Pharisees. It's a really good 227 reading. If I had a lot of time, I would 228 just do some type of dramatic reading for 229 it, 'cause it's really good. Um So the 230 Pharisees are asking Jesus questions, and 231 he's giving them answers, and they're 232 kinda debating him, and as you read this, 233 you can see the tensionramping up, 234 right?And Jesus says something like, you 235 know, well, you know, I do the works of 236 my father, and they're like, well, our 237 father's Abraham. And he goes, something 238 like, you know, if if you were Abraham's 239 children, then you would you would know 240 me and you would rejoice. Now let's pick 241 it up right here in verse 56. Your father 242 Abraham rejoiced that he would see my 243 day. He saw it and was glad. 244 So the Jesus said to him, You're not yet 245 50 years old, and you've seen Abraham? 246 And Jesus said to them, Truly, truly, I 247 say to you, before Abraham was, 248 I am. So I started with Exodus 249 because one of the first things as a 250 Christian you kind of put together are 251 those two verses, right?And that really 252 ties it together. And the Pharisees were 253 intimately familiar with this verse. Um 254 And Jesus is clear. He's clear in his 255 claim. Not before Abraham I was. 256 Maybe I'm older than Abraham. I'm 2600 257 years old, instead of 2500 years old at 258 that point. Before Abraham was, I am. 259 He's claiming that he's self-existent, 260 that he's eternal. That's a pretty big 261 claim. It would be blasphemous 262 if it weren't true, which is exactly how 263 the Pharisees, if you read after that, 264 responded. 265 So my my objective here is to help you 266 create a picture of Jesus, the I am the 267 self-existent one, and then take that 268 into your your daily prayer 269 lives. You know how you interact, how you 270 live your life, right?But having this 271 this picture of the Christ 272 that he is. eternal, 273 self-existent. So I'm going to use a 274 familiar verse to frame the discussion. 275 So if you guys return to 2 Peter 3:8, 276 page 10, 19,

277 in the black Bibles. Now, the context 278 of this verse, I'm real big on context, 279 right, 'cause you can't just take these 280 verses and you pick 'em out all over the 281 place, right?So I'm really big on 282 context. The context of this verse is the church, early church, had been 283 284 hearing, you know, Jesus is gonna be 285 coming back, Jesus is gonna be coming 286 back soon, right, it's imminent. They've 287 been waiting, and they're going, well, 288 when's this gonna happen, right?And so 289 this is Peter's answer to this. 290 So I've kind of taken this out of context 291 just to frame some discussions, but I 292 think it does make this statement, even 293 though that's not the intent of the 294 purpose of this. People have used this 295 verse 296 to claim different things. Let's read it 297 real quick, and you guys will be familiar 298 with this. 8, 299 But do not overlook this one fact, 11. 300 That with the Lord, one day is a thousand 301 years, and a thousand years as 302 one day. We've heard that before, right? 303 In fact, you know some people try to use 304 this verse to say that the earth is 305 6,000 years old, and we're getting ready 306 to go into the seventh, hence the 307 millennium, and maybe that's true. I 308 don't know. Could be. 309 That's not what this verse is talking about, though, so let's don't use that 310 311 one as our hinchpin for that. 312 What this is saying is that God doesn't 313 experience time the way we do. 314 That's what he's saying. In fact, we know 315 that's true, because even we don't 316 experience time the same way as each 317 other. Our satellites, when you put the 318 satellites up into space, just have a 319 little bit of difference, they have to 320 set the clocks a little bit slower so 321 that they stay synced 322 with the time on Earth, because time runs 323 at a different pace 324 around the Earth. By the way, time 325 from here to here 326 runs at a perceptible difference. So 327 when we get caught up on time with God, 328 we're working on the wrong subject, right? 329 So a day is a thousand years. 330 Well, the first one, a thousand years is 331 a day. That one makes sense, right?I've 332 always wondered and kind of 333 pondered, okay, a day is a thousand 334 years, right?I'm sorry, a thousand years 335 is a day, right, because God's so long, 336 you know, ohh that was just a day ago. As 337 you get older, right, time seems to go 338 faster, right?But a day being a thousand 339 years, I've always found that phrase 340 interesting. A day, I 341 mean, I've had some long days, but not a 342 day that felt like a thousand years, 343 right?So what does that mean?So I think 344 the first one, a thousand years is a day, 345 talks to the fact that Jesus

346 is eternal, right, she goes on, and we'll 347 hit that. And the second one is, I think 348 it really points to that Jesus is 349 infinite. You can take out however much 350 space you got, and he can chop that thing 351 up as much as he needs to, to get 352 anything done. So that's what we're going 353 to talk about today. And my hope is that 354 when you step into his presence, um 355 you'll step in with a different presence 356 of mind. So Jesus is eternal, a 357 thousand years is like a day, eternity is 358 notcomprehensible by us. We 359 can't really uhm comprehend eternity. 360 So let's go to Ecclesiastes 311, 361 page 554, and the Black Bibles. 362 Again, probably a familiar verse to a lot 363 of folks. He has made everything 364 beautiful in its time. Also he has put 365 eternity into man's heart, yet so 366 that he cannot find out what God has done 367 from the beginning to the end. So 368 when we think about eternity's future, you 369 know We're all going to go to heaven for 370 eternity. When we think about that, that 371 one we can kind of get our heads around a 372 little bit. We think about the longest 373 thing we could possibly think of, and 374 it's longer than that. That's how we 375 think about eternity going forward. And 376 to be honest with you, when you really 377 think about it, you start thinking about 378 maybe you're going to get bored. I hear 379 people talk about, I don't want to go to 380 heaven, it's going to be boring after a 381 while. And you think about it, and that's 382 true. That's true. Take any good thing 383 that we do in life, and if you do too 384 much of it, it gets foreign, 385 right?So that's kind of our warped 386 thought of eternity going forward. The 387 big one, though, is eternity 388 past. That 389 That one blows our minds. Something that 390 has no beginning. That is mind-blowing. 391 And that's why I think the world and 392 mankind has spent so much time trying to 393 to define that, to explain that, because 394 we just can't get our minds around that. 395 So the first point I want to make is a 396 very big one. Jesus has no beginning. 397 Jesus has no beginning. 398 So, just for the sake of time, I'm going 399 to read the next one. You guys can, you 400 don't have to turn to it, but it's Psalm 401 92-4. Before the mountains were brought 402 forth, or even you had formed the earth, 403 and the world from everlasting to 404 everlasting, you are God. I'll finish the 405 rest of it. You return man to dust and 406 say, Return, oh child of man. For a 407 thousand years is in your sight, but as 408 yesterday when it's past, or as a watch 409 in the night. I added the last part 410 because it kind of said the same thing 411 that Peter said, I knew that right. 412 So So this tells us that God 413 existed before the earth, because he 414 formed it, And he's God from everlasting

415 to everlasting, from eternity past to 416 eternity future, 417 right?1 and 2, 418 this is page 886 in the black 419 Bibles. Again, very familiar. 420 In the beginning was the word, and the 421 word was with God. And the word was God. 422 He was in the beginning with God. 423 So here we tie very closely 424 that Jesus is God. 425 He's always existed. He's self-existent. It doesn't say that 426 427 Jesus was with God at the 428 beginning, like he started at the same 429 time. He was there in the beginning, 430 right?Just like in the beginning, God 431 created the heavens and earth. That's another bonus one, Genesis one. Um 432 433 So this is where we see that 434 this concept of God being God 435 from everlasting eternity past to 436 eternity forward applies to Jesus. 437 He's always existed, but not with the 438 same name, right?Um 439 He came to earth, put on a body of a man, 440 and that's where he got the name that we 441 now use today. But he existed before 442 that, right?And there's 443 pictures and stuff in the Old Testament 444 But he didn't go by Jesus at that point, 445 right?If somebody interacted 446 with him, they wouldn't have said, oh, Jesus, here. They would've said an angel 447 of God or someone who looks like a God or 448 449 something like that, right?Which are the 450 references that you see. So what does that imply?Well, that implies 451 452 that as the self-existent one, this 453 entity that's always existed, he 454 created all that exists. 455 So let's take a look at Psalm 102, 456 page 502. um 457 Of old you laid the foundations of the 458 earth, and the heavens are the works of 459 your hands. They will perish, but you 460 will remain. They will wear out like a 461 garment. You will change them like a 462 robe, and they will pass away, but you 463 are the same, and your years 464 have no end. Again, the last part 465 speaking to to the eternity. Side, 466 the first part is that you laid the 467 foundations of the Earth, and the heavens 468 are the works of your hands. Do you guys 469 see any of the pictures coming out of the 470 telescopes, the Hubble telescope, and 471 another one that we have now?Yeah, yeah It's crazy, isn't it?It's crazy. 472 473 There are more galaxies in this 474 universe than there's stars in the Milky 475 Way galaxy. It's amazing, 476 and some people look at that and they go, 477 Oh, science, and oh my gosh, butI look at 478 that and go, holy cow, somebody created 479 that. And when you look at that 480 and just imagine the 481 immensity of that, that's the 482 immensity of our 483 self-existent God.

484 That's the image, right? That's the image. 485 So, So let's 486 Actually, you'll have to look these up 487 just for time. 3, 488 all things were made through Him, 3, 489 excuse me, all things were made through 490 Him, and without Him not anything was 491 made. 16 and 492 17, for by Him all things were created in 493 heaven and earth, invisible and 494 invisible, whether thrones or dominions 495 or rulers or authorities. All things were 496 created through Him and before Him, and 497 He is before all things, and in Him all 498 things hold together. And then 499 Revelations 9 or 49 through 11. 500 This is a picture. It's in heaven, right? 501 This is what we're going to be saying in 502 heaven. And the four living creatures, 503 each of them had six wings full of eyes 504 all around and within. Day and night, 505 they never cease to say, Holy, holy, 506 holy is the Lord God Almighty, who was 507 and is to come. Whenever the living 508 creatures give glory and honor and thanks 509 to him who's seated on the throne, who lives forever and ever, the 24 elders, 510 511 they fall down before him who are seated 512 on the throne, and they worship him, who 513 lives forever and ever, and they cast 514 their crowns before them, saying, Worthy 515 are you, oh Lord, to receive glory. and honor and power, for you created all 516 517 things. And by your will, 518 not even just power at this point, will, 519 by your will, they existed and were 520 created. So the second person 521 of the Godhead was an 522 agent in creation. And that's a 523 huge claim. When he said, I am, that's 524 what he's saying. That's a huge claim. So 525 what was his proof?What was his proof, 526 right?Um And his proof 527 was thatHe can manipulate the physical 528 world. Let's think about this for a 529 second. I'm going to use a personal 530 example. Here's one of my my analogies. 531 When I was a developer, first starting 532 off, I worked at this company, and I had 533 to build an application that that 534 worked at a hotel company. We owned all 535 these different hotels. Now it's part of 536 Hilton. One of the applications I wrote 537 was one of these screens came up, and it 538 had a form that had 539 Picked a hotel and it had all this hotel 540 information about it, you know, so the 541 the corporate people could look stuff up 542 and so forth, right?But as a developer, I 543 needed to know that code, right? 544 Everything's got a computer code that 545 goes with it. I needed to know what that 546 code was. Nobody else really needed to, 547 but I needed to. So I did it so 548 that if you clicked on the name, it would 549 switch to the code. If you clicked on it, 550 it came back. Nobody would click on it, 551 right?So that's what I did, right?But it 552 ended up getting in the hands of somebody

553 in the new organisation that did need to 554 know that code. And so they were calling 555 me up and asking some questions, and they 556 said, well, I got this problem. We need 557 to figure out what the code is. I don't 558 know what the code is. I'm like, click on 559 that that caption box. That will give you 560 the code. No, it won't. Yes, it will. 561 Just try it. So she clicks on it, she 562 goes, Holy cow, how did you know that?I'm like, well, I wrote it. It did it, 563 564 right?And And that's it's a 565 really simple example, 566 but that's exactly the purpose for the 567 miracles that Jesus did. And he didn't do 568 just one or two of them, he did lots of 569 them. The man is in history because of 570 the impact he had on this world. 571 And that was demonstrated and gave him 572 credibility through the miracles that he 573 did. I'm not gonna read all these, but I 574 mean, just just run through them, right? 575 6-9, changed water into wine. 576 37-41, he was able to stop the 577 wind. Who is he that can control the 578 weather that they obey him, right? 579 6-11, he healed the blind man, he spit on 580 something and he rubbed it on his eyes 581 and all of a sudden he was healed, right, 582 but even better than that, 583 2-9, the centurion comes up and says, 584 Hey, my servant's sick. He was well, I'll 585 go tell him, No, no, it's okay, you don't have to go. I'm a man of authority. If 586 587 you just say it, I tell my people to go 588 do something and they go do it. If you 589 say it, it'll be done. And it was, 590 right?He can manipulate 591 the physical world. And if you think 592 about it, how can he do that?It's because 593 he made it. He made the 594 atoms. He made the quarks, the gluons, 595 the lipids. He knew about the Higgs boson 596 particle, the God particle, because he 597 made it. He knows the stuff. 598 He knows what gravity is. Nobody knows what gravity is. He knows what causes 599 600 mass. Why is this thing 601 hard?He understands that. 602 Because he made it. We try to separate 603 the spiritual world and God and Jesus 604 from the physical world, but he made 605 that. It's It's not this 606 huge chasm, right? 607 He understands time violation. He 608 understands, he knows 609 whether everything is made-up of 610 vibrating strings or energy waves, 611 which is a big theory in physical theory, physics theory, right?So he 612 613 understands that. And if he understands 614 all that and built it, when someone says, 615 Hey, I need to know the hotel code, and 616 he says, Well, click on this, well, 617 that's not going to work, right?Holy cow, 618 how did you do that?I mean, 619 that part isn't amazing. The amazing part 620 is who he is. But once you understand 621 that, the rest of it is really not that

622 unlogical. It's a natural 623 progression, right? 624 And as we learn more and more, man is 625 able to do more and more of these 626 miracles, right?Because when we 627 understand something, we call it science. When we don't understand something, we 628 629 call it a miracle, right?But honestly, I 630 think it's just a continuum. That's my 631 opinion, my opinion. So anyhow, 632 so the first picture is that Jesus is 633 big, and he is eternal. He's worthy of 634 our worship. and not to be taken 635 casually. And that's the big thing I 636 wanted to walk away from this first part 637 from with everybody is is 638 if you've got a very casual picture of 639 Jesus in your mind, he's my buddy, he's 640 my copilot, right?He's my friend, 641 he is your friend. He says that, he's 642 your brother. But he is also 643 an eternal being that created all of 644 those galaxies that we see out there. And 645 we take that lightly and we try to 646 casualize him, right?I 647 think we do ourselves in injustice. I 648 think we do the creator of the universe 649 in injustice. So 650 So how can something so big 651 care about me? 652 It's big. I'm just this little bitty 653 thing, right?So this gets us to a 654 day is a thousand years. Now I could 655 explore the infiniteness of 656 Christ. Lots of different ways, but I'm 657 gonna keep it to one. I'm gonna keep it personal because, you know, if we're all 658 659 honest, if we're all honest, in our 660 minds, it's all about me, right?God's all 661 about me. It's about what's in my head, 662 when I'm thinking my opinion, right? 663 That's the mental image that I talked 664 about earlier, right?We all create a God 665 in our own minds that bends to the way 666 that we think, right?So let's turn over 667 to Psalms 139. We're gonna do a few 668 verses there, so you can keep your finger 669 there. So page 521 in the black Bibles. 670 Oh Lord, you have searched me and have 671 known me. You know when I sit down and 672 when I rise up, you discern my thoughts 673 from afar, you search out my path and my 674 lying down, and are acquainted with all 675 my ways, even before a word 676 is on my tongue. 677 Behold, oh Lord, you know it altogether. 678 God knows me 679 better than I know myself. He knows me. 680 Two hours from now, I think I know where 681 I'm going to be in two hours, right?But I 682 can't tell you where I'll be in two days. 683 I can't tell you where I'll be in two 684 years. But God knows he 685 knows everything about me. You keep your 686 finger there. I'm going to read a couple 687 more right quick. So Matthew 1029 through 688 31. Again, very familiar passages. 689 Are not two sparrows sold for a penny, 690 and not one of them will fall to the

691 ground apart from your father?Even the 692 hairs on your head are all numbered. Fear 693 not, therefore you are of more value than 694 many sparrows. And then Matthew 6:26, 695 Look at the birds of the air, neither 696 they sow nor reap nor gather into barns, 697 yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are 698 you not of more value than 699 these?So God knows, 700 God knows every bit of life that has 701 existed intimately, existed on this 702 planet from the very beginning, 703 whether you think it was 6000 years ago, 704 whether you think it was 6 million years 705 ago, whether you think it was 60 million 706 years ago, right? And by the way, the 707 bigger that number gets, the more 708 incredible God becomes if you think about 709 it, right?And he 710 knows every single person. So actually 711 when I was writing this little piece 712 right here, just kind of jotting down my 713 notes, I was actually in a taxi in India 714 heading to the office. Got my laptop out 715 there. It's about a 15 minute drive. So I 716 pulled my laptop out and I thought I'd take some notes on this. And I got to 717 718 this point. I wrote that down that he 719 knows every single one of us. And I 720 looked around and I'm surrounded. I'm in 721 a traffic jam. I've got motorbikes going 722 by, two or three people on them. I've got 723 this open air bus. right, under this whole thing of traffic. I got people 724 725 going in between, you know, throngs of 726 people walking in between the cars when 727 they're stuck at the the traffic jams, 728 right?And I thought, oh my 729 goodness, God knows the thought that's 730 going through every single one of these 731 people's minds at that exact moment. 732 And he knows what they're going to be 733 thinking two hours from now, two 734 days from now, 10 years from now. 735 He knows that intimate level of detail 736 on everything. Well, how can he know all 737 of this?Because he's infinite. Have 738 you ever thought, or has anybody ever 739 asked you, how can God listen to all 740 those prayers at the same time?Right? 741 We're all sitting in here and we pray our 742 our prayer of of 743 forgiveness, right?And we're 744 all saying, you know, Lord, I was this 745 this week, or I did this this week, and I 746 shouldn't have, sorry. Please forgive me. 747 How can you listen to all of us at the 748 same time? Is he time-slicing, you know? 749 Because he's infinite. And just like 750 eternity, we really can't grasp infinity, 751 right?It's very weird. So I'm going to 752 give you a thought exercise. I'm a 753 mathematician by my bachelor's degree, 754 right, so I I do a lot of thinking. I'm 755 going to give you a thought exercise. 756 When I heard this the first time, I was 757 like, wow, this helps me 758 understand that I don't understand 759 infinity, right?So

760 Imagine you've got a hotel that's got an 761 infinite number of rooms. Okay? 762 Infinite number of rooms. And it's full. 763 Okay?And the guy walks up and says, 764 I'd like a room for the night. What do 765 you do?You're full. By definition, that I just gave you, you're full. What do you 766 767 do?Well, the hotel manager gets on the 768 phone and says, Hey, guys, I need 769 everybody to walk out the room and go one 770 room over. And they stick him in room one. Or if your computer guy, room zero. 771 772 Right?Pretty amazing. 773 What if a bus comes up that's got an 774 infinite number of people in it, and they 775 walk up and they say, We need a room. Now 776 what do you do?Right?Manager gets on the 777 phone, tells all the rooms, I want you to 778 step outside your door, look at your room 779 number, whatever the number is, double 780 it, and go get in that room. And now 781 you've got an infinite number of rooms 782 for people to go into. That's logical. 783 That's true. That's hard to get your mind 784 around, isn't it?Right?So we can 785 appreciate it, but we we can't 786 really grasp it. God is infinite. So with 787 that concept that God is infinite 788 and understands all this stuff, let's 789 keep looking at Psalm 139, seven through 790 16. So where shall I go from your spirit, 791 or where shall I flee from your presence? If I ascend to heaven, you are there, if 792 793 I make my bed and shield, You are there. 794 If I take the wings of the morning and 795 dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, 796 even there your hand shall lead me, and 797 your right hand shall hold me. If I say, 798 'Surely the darkness shall cover me, and 799 the light about me be night, ' even the 800 dark is not dark to you, and the night 801 is bright as day, for darkness is as 802 light with you. Actually, there's some 803 really interesting stuff about that one, 804 but we'll skip over that. For you 805 formed my inward parts, you knitted me 806 together in my mother's womb, I 807 praise you for I am fearfully and 808 wonderfully made. Wonderful are your 809 works. My soul knows it very well. 810 My frame was not hidden from you when I 811 was being made in secret, intricately 812 woven in the depths of the earth. And 813 that means the womb, right?Your eyes saw 814 my unformed substance, and in your 815 book were written every one of them, the 816 days that were formed for me, yet when 817 there was none of them. 818 When you think about the fact that God is 819 infinite, that makes sense. It 820 does, right?But again, 821 we can't comprehend it, right?So if you 822 go down to verse six, and then verse 17 823 and 18, verse six, Such knowledge is too 824 wonderful for me, it's high, I can't 825 attain it. And then 17 and 18, How 826 precious to me are your thoughts, oh God, 827 how vast is the sun?If I would count 828 them, they're more than the sand, and

829 that's back when they couldn't number the 830 They couldn't imagine anything more than 831 number of grains of sand, right?Now we've 832 got galaxies in the in the universe. 833 So Isaiah 4028, 834 I'll do this one and then you guys can go 835 ahead and go to Isaiah 5589. 836 28, by the way, this is from a famous 837 chapter. If you read that chapter, you're 838 gonna recognize lots of verses in there. 839 It's the flower fades, the rest was in 840 the flower fades verse. It's the voice 841 crying in the wilderness. It's the 842 renew your strength, wings of eagles. It's a good chapter, right?But 843 844 But verses 25 through 28, 845 to whom then will you compare me, that 846 I should be like him, says the Holy One. 847 Lift up your eyes on high and see who 848 created these. Who brings out?Who 849 brings out their hosts by number, calling 850 them all by names? The host being the 851 stars, right?By the 852 greatness of his might, and 853 because he is a strong power, not one is 854 missing. Why do you say, O Jacob, and 855 speak, O Israel, my way is hidden from 856 the Lord, and my right hand is 857 disregarded by God?Right?Ooh, God doesn't 858 see what I'm doing. Or maybe God doesn't 859 care what I'm doing, right?Or what's 860 happening to me. Have you not known?Have 861 you not heard? The Lord is an everlasting 862 God, the creator of the ends of the 863 earth. He does not faint or grow weary. 864 His understanding is unsearchable. Again, 865 guys, trying to understand and wrap our 866 brain around this, it's tough. It's 867 impossible, right?And let's do Isaiah 868 55, 8, 9 again. Very 869 familiar verse. For my thoughts are not 870 your thoughts, neither are your ways my 871 ways, declares the Lord. For as the 872 heavens are higher than the earth, so are 873 my ways higher than your ways, and my 874 thoughts than your thoughts. So his 875 thoughts are above our thoughts. 876 Um And actually, talking about reading 877 our Bibles and stuff, one of the reasons 878 why I want folks to actually look this up 879 is because when you read your Bibles, you 880 see the context, right?You can put your 881 marker and you can go back and read it 882 later because you've got it right there. 883 You can write notes because you write a 884 note, you go, oh my word, I understand 885 this. Or maybe the Lord's speaking to me or saying something. You can write that 886 887 note and then you can come back two or three years later and you can read it 888 889 again, right?That's why we should be 890 bringing our Bibles to church and that's 891 why we should have them open. We should 892 be looking at them. Because when God 893 speaks to you, if you write it down and 894 you come back to it two years later, 895 three years later. Or in my case, 30 896 years later, 40, 897 40 years later. Because

898 when I looked up this passage, I happened 899 to look down at the bottom, and there was 900 a note that I had made somewhere between 901 1986 and 1990, 'cause 902 it was in one of those old Bibles that I 903 had, right? And my margin note, from a 904 teenager or 20-something-year-old kid, 905 21-year-old kid, I don't have to 906 understand, just be faithful. 907 Right?And as you start off, you don't 908 understand a lot of stuff. And as you 909 mature, you then start understanding. You 910 start seeing this stuff tying together, 911 and you go, Wow. Right?Because God is 912 infinite, and we will do that, you know, 913 forever. But my point here 914 to myself was when I run across something that I don't understand, it's okay. It's 915 916 okay. It's okay to ask God questions. 917 Right?It's okay to question and go, What 918 does this mean?He's not afraid of your 919 questions. But, sorry, that was 920 preaching, and I don't preach. So the 921 second picture I've got that I want you 922 guys to have is that God is infinite. 923 God's availability for us is 924 infinite. God's, 925 our learning and entertainment 926 that we're going to have in heaven, when 927 we think about eternity going forward, 928 it's infinite. Are we going to get bored? 929 No. Well, how can that be?Because it's 930 infinite, right?And 931 we just can't get our heads around that. 932 That's so tough, right?Um 933 We can't We can't comprehend 934 them, and we don't know God's plan 935 outside of what we can point to in the 936 Bible. And anybody that tells you 937 different, go look it up in the Bible 938 before you decide to believe it, right? 939 Because his ways are not our ways, his 940 thoughts are not our thoughts. When 941 someone tries to tell you different, 942 question that. All right, so practical 943 application. Um My hope here 944 is that this little picture, the 945 self-existent one, both his internalness 946 and his his infiniteness 947 influences prayer and worship, which then 948 affects your daily life, your life 949 choices, and your attitudes about what's 950 important. So you got the 951 eternality of Christ, you 952 know, viewing your choices 953 in light of eternity, right?And I 954 see this in the church too, right?I never 955 thought I would, but I do. There is an 956 acceptance that the means justify the 957 ends. We see that in our culture, 958 but we see it in our church. And that is 959 so wrong. Because eternity, there are no 960 ends. There's only means. 961 And we are in eternity right now, guys. 962 It's not the other side of eternity. We 963 are in it right now. 964 Infiniteness, viewing others in light of 965 Christ's infiniteness, He cares for you, 966 He knows you. But He also

967 cares for that person, and for that 968 person, and for this person over here, 969 right? Things that make me feel superior 970 to somebody else, they pale 971 in comparison. God 972 is so beyond your circle. He's so beyond your mind, which is where I 973 974 spend a lot of my time, right?He's so 975 beyond your family. He's so beyond your 976 friends, your church, your political 977 affiliations, your socio-economical 978 Classifications, your lifestyle choices, 979 your nationality, even your point in time 980 in history. He is so beyond all of that. 981 So we do tend to try to partialize God, 982 and we make him too casual, right?And he is true. He is there for you. He is 983 984 infinite. There's enough of him that you 985 need because he's infinite, right?But 986 he's also this for everybody else. 987 UmmAnd the last thing I want to hit was 988 just increase your faith. So I'm hoping 989 that this will increase your faith. And 990 in the light of the immensity of Jesus, 991 what does that require of us?And so I'm 992 going to finish on on one interesting 993 story. So guys, please open to Mark 9:14 994 through 24, and that's page 844 995 in your Bibles, the black ones. 996 So the context of this verse is 997 Jesus and and three of the disciples have 998 had this amazing experience on the 999 mountain, transfiguration, right?They're 1000 coming down, there's some 1001 chaos, there's some discussions going on 1002 with the rest of the disciples and some 1003 people, and so this is where the 1004 story picks up. So when they came to the 1005 disciples, they saw a great crowd 1006 gathered around them, and the scribes 1007 argue with them, and immediately the 1008 crowd said when they saw him, they were 1009 greatly amazed, and ran up to him and 1010 greeted him, and he asked them, What are 1011 you arguing about with them?And then 1012 someone from the crowd answered, Teacher, 1013 I brought my son to you, for he has a 1014 spirit that makes him mute. And whenever 1015 it seizes him, it throws him down and he 1016 foams and grinds his teeth and becomes 1017 rigid. I asked your disciples to cast it 1018 out, but they were not able. And he 1019 Jesus answered him, oh, faithless 1020 generation, how long am I going to be 1021 with you?How long am I to bear with you? 1022 Bring it to me. And they brought the boy 1023 to him, and when the Spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy, and he 1024 1025 fell on the ground and rolled about, 1026 foaming out of the mouth. And Jesus asked 1027 his father, How long has this been 1028 happening to him?He says, From childhood. 1029 It has often cast him into the fire and 1030 into the water and destroyed him, 1031 but if you can do anything, have 1032 compassion on us and help us out. And 1033 Jesus said to him, If you can. 1034 If?All things. 1035 All things are possible for one who

1036 believes. 1037 And immediately the father of the child cried out and said, I believe, help my 1038 1039 unbelief. 1040 Amazing verse. I've actually 1041 lived a lot of my life on that one, right? 1042 But, and this is why you should study 1043 your Bibles, guys. Let's go over to the same story. In Matthew 714 through 1044 1045 20, that's page 822, 1046 same thing. When they came down to the 1047 crowd and a man came up to him, kneeling 1048 before him, said Lord have mercy on me, 1049 my son, for he has seizures and he 1050 suffers terribly, for he falls into the 1051 fire and off into the water. And I 1052 brought him to your disciples and they 1053 cannot heal him. And Jesus answered, O 1054 faithless and twisted generation, how 1055 long am I to be with you?How long am I to 1056 bear with you?Bring him here to me. And 1057 Jesus, Jesus rebuked the demon and it 1058 came out of him. The boy was healed 1059 essently and the disciples came up to. 1060 Here's the new part, here's the new part. 1061 And guys, this is, this isThis is pretty 1062 cool, because you've heard this your 1063 entire lives. Then the disciples came to 1064 Jesus privately and said, Why could we 1065 not cast it out?And he said, Because of your little faith. For truly I say to 1066 1067 you, if you have faith, like a grain of a 1068 mustard seed, you will say to this 1069 mountain, Move from here to there, and it 1070 will move, and nothing will be impossible 1071 for you. That's where we get faith of a 1072 mustard seed. So have you ever thought 1073 about what that mustard seed is? It's I 1074 believe, help my unbelief. That's a 1075 mustard seed. That's how big the mustard 1076 seed is. So uhm 1077 so behold, Jesus, I I am, the eternal and 1078 infinite, who asked me to have faith the 1079 size of the mustard seed, and that, 1080 that's the picture of Jesus I wanted to 1081 share with you guys. So let's pray. So 1082 Lord Jesus, we acknowledge that you are 1083 the self-existent one. You are eternal. 1084 You have no beginning. You have no end. 1085 Your worthy receive honor and glory and 1086 power, for you created all things, and by 1087 your will they existed and were created, 1088 and you are infinite. You care about 1089 every person and creature on this planet 1090 throughout all of time, including me, 1091 but not just me. So Lord, we believe, 1092 help our unbelief. Amen. 1093 Let's stand and see if our people 1094 respond. Let's crown him and take crowns, 1095 let's send first and last verse again.
