- 1 As many of you know, Pastor Jay
- 2 is leading us through a sermon series on
- 3 Philippians, but he's out of
- 4 town, and so we're not doing Philippians
- 5 today. He will be back
- 6 next week, and this week,
- 7 he said, you know, he gave me a choice of
- 8 whatever I wanted to do, and I
- 9 decided that it's a good time to start
- 10 Mission Month. Mission Month isn't until
- 11 August, okay?uh But
- 12 you can never have too much mission,
- 13 right?So
- 14 think of this as the first in a series of
- 15 two messages for the beginning of mission
- 16 month. And the next part two of this
- 17 sermon will be given one month
- 18 from now in the first Sunday of August.
- 19 I remember many, many years ago, when I
- 20 was a boy, and that would have been way
- 21 back in the last century,
- 22 I was a Boy Scout, and to this
- 23 day, I still kind of remember the Boy
- 24 Scout oath. On my honor,
- 25 I will do my best to do my
- 26 duty to God and
- 27 my country, and to obey the Scout
- law, to help others at all
- 29 times, to keep myself
- 30 physically fit, mentally awake
- 31 and morally straight.
- 32 Notice the word God in that.
- 33 To do my duty to God and my
- 34 country. We see the word God
- 35 frequently in our culture today. We
- 36 see it all around us in America. On our
- 37 money, it says, In God we trust.
- 38 We sing God Bless
- 39 America, and in the Pledge of Allegiance
- 40 to one GodWe pledge allegiance to the
- 41 flag of the United States of America and
- 42 to the Republic for which it stands, one
- 43 nation under God. But all
- 44 too often nowadays, the word God has
- 45 lost its meaning. People say it in a
- 46 non-reverential way. They just throw
- 47 it out like, oh God, can you believe what
- 48 she did?Or, oh God, you won't believe the
- 49 day that I had. It's just another word in
- our vocabulary nowadays. We use it
- 31 a lot of us, hopefully none of us here,
- 52 but in our culture, we use God, the word
- 53 God, indiscriminately.
- 54 I was I was reading
- 55 not too long ago um in a book
- 56 called How Not to be Secular
- 57 by James K. A. Smith,
- and he made this observation. He
- 59 said that, Go back to the year
- 60 1500, And if you ask people
- in Europe or or the colonies in
- North America, are you a Christian? They'd
- 63 say yes. Now, the
- 64 depth of their Christianity may not be
- 65 perhaps as deep as we would like it to
- 66 be, but it was just a cultural thing.
- 67 Everybody would say that they were a
- 68 Christian. Everybody went to church on
- 69 Sunday. They celebrated Christmas and

Easter. It was just part of the fabric of 71 the of the of the culture. Today, it's 72 not that way. Today, 73 if you ask somebody if they're a 74 Christian, some people will say yes, 75 just because culturally that's what they 76 think they're supposed to do. A lot of 77 people will tell you that they don't believe in God. They'll tell you that 78 79 they're an atheist or they'll tell you 80 that, Well, you know what? 81 Jesus was just a good teacher and I don't 82 believe that he is who everybody says 83 that he is. Well, 84 That's not exactly 85 the way that it should be. People should know the real God. People should know the 87 real Jesus. People should respond to 88 the real Holy Spirit and not to 89 to the way that culture is. We need 90 to, pardon the expression, get back to 91 the Bible. And the Bible tells us 92 that we are to be prepared. 93 to tell people about Jesus Christ, to 94 preach the good news. As the Boy Scout 95 motto, Be prepared. I remember my grandmother used to say, You should 96 97 always wear clean underwear, because you 98 never know when you're going to go to the 99 emergency room. 100 We are to be ready to tell people about 101 Jesus in season and out of 102 season. And our 103 Bible passage for 104 today comes from Second Timothy, 105 the fourth chapter, verses one through five. And it says, I charge you in the 106 107 presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who 108 is to judge the living and the dead, and 109 by his appearing in his kingdom, preach 110 the word. Be ready in season and out of 111 season. Reprove, rebuke, and exhort with 112 complete patience and teaching. For the 113 time is coming when people will not 114 endure sound teaching, but having itching 115 ears, they will accumulate for themselves 116 teachers to suit their own passions 117 and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. As 118 119 for you, always be sober minded, 120 enduring suffering, do the work of an 121 evangelist, fulfill your 122 ministry. Let's pray. 123 Lord Jesus, we are your people and we 124 know that you want us to tell people 125 about you. We pray that you will prepare 126 us to do so. We pray that our lives would 127 be totally surrendered to you, and as 128 such, we can go forth and tell 129 others the truth of the gospel. And we 130 pray this, dear Jesus, in your name, in 131 Jesus' name, amen. 132 So this passage begins with a charge. 133 Paul says to Timothy that, I charge you. 134 He gives them a charge. And what is a 135 charge?A chargeYou're telling somebody 136 what you want them to do. You're telling 137 them that this is what you are supposed

138

to do. And as Paul is

- telling this to Timothy, he's saying, you
- know, this isn't just my charge. 140
- 141 This is a charge that comes from God and
- 142 from Jesus, and Jesus is the judge of all
- 143 mankind. We have a charge.
- 144 And I know that you can look at this and
- 145 you can say, well, you know what?Paul was
- 146 writing to Timothy, and that's fine,
- 147 but. What does that have to do with me?
- 148 Well, actually, it's God's word to us,
- and so we should pay attention to it. And 149
- 150 we have a charge, and that charge is, in
- fact, the Great Commission. That's what 151
- 152 we're supposed to do. It was never a
- 153 secret. In Jesus' ministry, it was never
- 154 a secret that he wanted us to go out.
- 155 When he first calls his first disciples,
- 156 what does he say? He says, Come, follow
- 157 me, and I will make you
- 158 fishers of men. And then later, at the
- 159 end of his ministry here on earth, he
- 160 gives the Great Commission. It's a
- 161 Commission to each and every one of us. 162
- And just as Timothy was commissioned, so 163 are we commissioned to go out and to tell
- 164 people about Jesus Christ. And we're to
- 165 do it in season and out of season. It's
- 166 when he puts the opportunity before us.
- 167 That is when we are to be ready to tell
- 168 the people about Jesus Christ. It's a 169 time. Often not of our own choosing,
- 170 but here again, we are to be ready in
- 171 season and out of season.
- 172 And he he says
- 173 several things here. He says, To go out
- 174 and to reprove and to
- 175 rebuke and to exhort
- 176 and have complete patience and
- 177 and do complete teaching. To
- reprove means to admonish. 178
- 179 It means to tell others, to tell
- 180 others that there is a different and
- 181 better way to their lives, and that
- 182 better way for their lives is the
- 183 Christian way of life. But we have to be
- 184 careful that if we go out
- 185 and we tell people that there's a better
- 186 way to lead their lives, they're going to
- 187 look at us and they're going to say,
- 188 Well, how about the way that you lead
- 189 your life?And we're warned in Scripture
- 190 about things like gossiping.
- 191 Uh We need to avoid things like that. We
- 192 need to avoid anything that would damage
- 193 the message that we are given,
- 194 damage the commission that we are given
- 195 to spread the word of Jesus Christ, to
- 196 spread the gospel. And so we don't want
- 197 to do things like like gossip
- 198 or tell
- 199 dirty stories, things like
- 200 that. No, we want to live a
- 201 Christian life. And therefore, when we
- 202 do tell people, when we do give
- 203 them a word of reproof,
- 204 they can take it seriously, and they'll
- 205 know that we are living what we
- 206 say. And we're to show
- 207 rebuke. We're to rebuke. And that means

- 208 that we show disapproval, that we don't
- go along with the things of the world. We don't go along with the things that we
- 211 know that Christis against.
- 212 We maintain the course. We're
- 213 steady. We're consistent. And
- 214 here again, people look at us and they
- go, Who are you to tell me?
- 216 And we need to be in a position that they
- 217 will be, that we will be
- 218 believable when we tell them, Well,
- 219 it's not actually us telling you. It's
- 220 the Lord telling you. And we need to
- 221 make sure that we are prepared to do this
- 222 by the way we lead our lives in season
- 223 and out of season. And here's the
- 224 big one for me. It is we're to
- 225 exhort. And when I saw
- 226 that and I thought, well, you know, how
- 227 am I going to explain this? And the first
- 228 word that came to me was the word adjure.
- 229 And I realized that if I said that,
- 230 nobody would know what I was talking
- 231 about. So exhort
- 232 means toto tell somebody
- 233 emphatically, to to have
- 234 passion. And to have
- 235 passion doesn't necessarily mean that
- 236 you're going to yell and shout at
- 237 somebody, but it means that you actually
- 238 believe in what you're saying, that
- you're you're willing to be there, you're
- 240 willing to stand up, and you're willing
- 241 to to take a little abuse if
- 242 that's what it comes to. And there's a
- 243 there's a thing thatthat
- 244 tends to be a problem among a great
- 245 deal of evangelical Christians, and
- 246 that is that we want to hide behind what 247 are the supposed words of St. Francis of
- 248 Assisi, where he
- 249 says, Go out
- and do good deeds,
- 251 preach through the deeds that you do,
- and if necessary, use words.
- 253 He never said that, okay?That's
- That's complete bunk. He didn't say that.
- 255 And the Franciscans, which
- 256 is the Catholic
- 257 organization that that named itself after
- 258 him and follows his teachings, they will
- 259 tell you, He never said that.
- 260 And it's not even biblical. We're to do
- 261 good deeds, we're to do good works, that
- 262 is true. But everything that we do
- 263 needs to point towards Jesus
- 264 Christ. And if it doesn't point towards
- 265 Jesus Christ, then it's really not a
- 266 good work. And I get that lecture all the
- 267 time from my friend Jerry Dunlap, who
- 268 tells me, You can do all the good works
- you want, but unless Jesus Christ is praised, it does not count. And Jerry
- Dunlap is right, okay?
- 272 His mother brought him up right.
- 273 What What it, this is something
- that's been adopted by a lot of people about good works, and you know, you don't,
- 276 Our good works will speak for themselves,

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not biblical. The saying is
278
      actually preach the gospel at all
279
      times and use words to
280
      explain what you do,
281
      okay?So it's not about doing
282
      good works. Now the Bible
283
      tells us that our works are a fruit of
284
      our faith, that they're a fruit from the
285
      Holy Spirit that it's a demonstration of
286
      our faith. But here's what the Bible
287
      says about preaching. And this
288
      comes from Romans, the 10th chapter,
289
      starting with verse 14 and going through
290
      17. It says, How
291
      then will they call on Him
292
      in whom they have not believed? And how
293
      are they to believe Him of whom they have
294
      never heard? And how are they to hear
295
      without someone preaching? And how are
296
      they to preach unless they are sent? As it
297
      was written, How beautiful are the feet of
298
      those who preach the good news, but they
299
     have not all obeyed the gospel. For
300
      Isaiah says, Lord, who has
301
      believed what he has heard from us?So
302
      faith comes from hearing, and
303
      hearing through the word of Christ.
304
      We are to tell people about
305
      Jesus. We don't just demonstrate it,
306
      because if we demonstrate it, they don't
307
      know why. They don't know why we do it.
308
      We can feed people, but you know what?
      There's a lot of secular organizations
309
310
      that do the same thing. We can hand out
311
      clothes, but there's a lot of secular
312
      organizations that do the same thing.
313
      There are a lot of things that we do, and
314
      we do them because. We are Christian,
315
      but other people will never know unless
316
      they're told. Now, I'm not in favor of
317
      hitting somebody upside the head with a
318
      Bible. That's going a little too far,
319
      usually. Come
320
      on, you all have children, okay?But
321
      people do need to be told what we're
322
      doing. and they need to be told the
323
      complete story. Not something that we
324
      make up to excuse ourselves, but they
325
      need to be told the whole story.
326
      And he says that Paul, in talking to
327
      Timothy, says we're to do this with
328
      complete patience and teaching.
329
      And my interpretation of that is we're to
330
      do it with complete patience and complete
331
      teaching. I'll tell you a story.
332
      Back many years ago, Actually, it was
333
      13 years ago. I took a
334
      friend out to look at Christmas lights.
335
      It was December. It was a great setting.
336
      It was cold. It was snowy. It
337
      was just, you know, exactly what you how
338
      you would want Christmas to be pictured.
339
      And we drove around Reno and we looked at
340
      Christmas lights and had a really good
341
      time. And then we came back
342
      and we went out and we had dessert. And
343
     my friend is from a foreign country. She
344
      was here doing research at the University
345
      of Nevada. And I told her, I said, You
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346
      know, we went and we saw a lot of really
347
      nice things. We saw Santa Claus
348
      and Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer.
349
      We saw Mickey Mouse, all
350
      sorts of really great things. But that's
351
      not what Christmas is about. What we
352
      didn't see was a manger scene,
353
      and we started talking about that.
354
     Andshe
355
     pointed out to me, she said, Yes, you
     know, the mother of Jesus was not
356
357
     married. I'm like, oh, okay.
358
      And she said, And she
359
      had a child, Jesus, and it
360
      wasn't even by her fiance.
361
      And I'm like, oh, last time I ever tell
362
      about Jesus.
      And And I'm thinking, you know, I need to
363
364
      get out of this somehow. And
365
      I kept thinking, well, you can't. You've
366
      got to tell. You've got to to go ahead
367
      and tell. I'm like, I can't.
368
      And why can't I tell this person about
369
      the virgin birth? The reason that I cannot
370
      tell this person about the virgin birth
371
      is she's a doctor,
372
      okay? That's a tough sell. I mean,
373
      you just... But But I
374
      I just felt that it was something that I
375
      needed to do. And I know that
376
      Scripture tells us thatthe
377
      Holy Spirit, he will provide the
378
      right words at the right time.
379
     And so I went ahead and I told her about
380
     the virgin birth and what it means and
381
      and all this stuff. And
382
      she used to come to covenant. She
383
      came to covenant for like about a year
384
      and a half. And eventually
385
      she went back to her own country, and
386
      I've talked to her since then, and we've
387
      kind of stayed in contact. And
388
     A while back, I I started talking to her
389
      about Jesus again, and she
390
      told me, she said, and
391
      I quote, My religion is
392
      communism. But that's not the whole
393
      story. You see, my friend
394
      had another friend who is also
395
      a doctor, and this other friend is
396
      actually a pretty sharp lady.
397
      As a matter of fact, she's one of these
398
     people that collects
399
      academic degrees, like,
400
      they're so easy. And she actually goes
401
      internationally and gives lectures.
402
      And my first friend
403
      told this other lady, her friend, about
404
      things that I'd been saying about the
405
      virgin birth, and she brings her friend
406
      to me, and it's like, Oh, great, we're
407
      going to go through this again. Her
408
      friend comes with me to church,
409
      and comes to church throughout the
410
      summer, throughout the year, actually,
411
      for a year, and she becomes a
412
      Christian. And I will tell you
413
      that 13 years later,
414
      every week, she and I get
```

- together over the phone, because she's in
- 416 another country, we get together, and we
- 417 pray together, and she prays for you,
- 418 okay? And I asked her one day, I
- 419 said, What is your conversion
- 420 story? How did you come to Christ?
- 421 And she said, When I walked in the door
- 422 at covenant, I knew there was something
- 423 different, and it was the Holy Spirit.
- 424 And I'm thinking to myself, Don't I get
- 425 any credit for this?
- 426 And the answer is, no.
- 427 Conversion is an act of the Holy Spirit.
- 428 And let me point something out to you
- 429 when it comes to Complete patience
- 430 and complete teaching. Our
- 431 patience is in the Lord. Our
- 432 patience is that He will do
- 433 that which He said He will do.
- 434 And the complete teaching is to
- 435 tell the whole story.
- 436 Don't be shy. It may sound strange at
- 437 times. And Scripture says that to some,
- 438 it'll sound like idiocy. It'll just be
- 439 confusion. But it's the Holy Spirit
- 440 that brings people to Christ. It's
- 441 not us. He works through us,
- 442 and we should always be ready in season
- 443 and out of season to let the Holy Spirit
- 444 work through us. But it's not us
- 445 that brings people to Christ. It's the
- 446 Holy Spirit, and we are to have patience
- with God, and we are to tell the whole 447
- story, and we know that Scripture 448
- 449 tells us His word,
- 450 will not return void.
- 451 So even though you may think that you're
- 452 butting your head against a wall when you
- 453 when you bear witness to Jesus Christ,
- 454 please know that, first of
- 455 all, Jesus knows what you're doing
- 456 because He's having you do it. And
- 457 secondly, His purpose is
- 458 going to be attained.
- We have challenges as we go forward and 459
- 460 we tell people about about Jesus.
- 461 And the scripture tells us that there's
- 462 going to be those who turn away, that
- 463 that you know their ears are tickled,
- 464 their imagination is excited,
- 465 and they're going to to look in this
- 466 direction, and they're going to look in
- 467 that direction, and they're going to to
- 468 just be all over the place. A
- 469 rhetorical question for you, and
- 470 rhetorical question means, I'll ask the
- 471 question, I'll also give you the
- 472 answer, but if you really want to give
- 473 the answer, you can just shout it out or
- 474 raise your hand or whatever. What
- 475 and when was the first
- 476 sin? And you're all sitting there going,
- 477 This is a trick question. Yes, it is.
- 478 The first sin was when Satan turned
- 479 away from God, when Satan

482

- 480 rebelled against God. Not to
- 481 be confused with the first sin of
- mankind, which was the Garden of Eden. 483 But here's what happened was, Satan

- rebelled against God. And you may have
- 485 heard it said, There are only two
- 486 religions. There's Christianity and
- 487 there's everything else.
- 488 Christianity is led by Jesus Christ and
- 489 Christ alone. Everything else is
- 490 led by the Lord of the Flies,
- 491 Beelzebub, Satan, whatever you want
- 492 to call him. If it's not
- 493 Christianity, then it's a
- 494 false religion. It's not really a
- 495 religion, the true religion.
- 496 And one of the things that we have to be
- 497 aware of, something that we need to be
- 498 very sensitive to, is
- 499 what is paraded under the banner of
- 500 Christianity. We,
- in our culture, we encounter 501
- 502 people that say that they have
- 503 a word from God, that God gave them a
- 504 message. We have people that say,
- 505 God gave me new scripture, and they write
- 506 it and publish it. We have people who say
- 507 that they're prophets, and they get a
- 508 lot of money for it.
- 509 Sometimes, the worst enemies of
- 510 Christianity are those who claim to be
- 511 Christians themselves. We
- 512 need to stay within the bounds of
- 513 orthodoxy. And the bounds of
- 514 orthodoxy are contained within the pages
- 515 of the Holy Bible. That is what we
- are to teach, and we are to be ready 516
- 517 in season and out of season. And
- 518 when somebody comes and starts to tell us
- 519 differently, then we need to
- 520 reprove, rebuke, and
- 521 exhort. We need to set
- 522 people on the right path. That is the
- 523 commission that we are given, the Great
- 524 Commission, is to tell people the truth
- 525 about Jesus Christ. It's
- 526 a challenge that we face, and
- 527 oftentimes we're not patient. And what
- 528 happens when we're not patient is that
- 529 we allow false teaching to go
- 530 unchecked, and we ourselves
- 531 need to check ourselves. We need to
- 532 remember that we are ambassadors for
- 533 Christ. That's what it says in the Bible,
- 534 we are ambassadors for Christ. And
- 535 as you know, an ambassador
- 536 represents their sovereign.
- 537 They don't represent themselves.
- 538 We are ambassadors for Christ. We must
- 539 always proclaim the truth in season and
- 540 out of season. And Second
- 541 Corinthians, fifth chapter,
- 542 verse 20 says, Therefore, we are
- 543 ambassadors for Christ. God making
- 544 his appeal through us, we implore
- 545 you on behalf of Christ, to be
- 546 reconciled to God, and that

551

- 547 reconciled to God is really,
- 548 really important. That's one of the
- 549 reasons why we confess our sins, that we
- 550 have the prayer of confession, is so that
- we ourselves are reconciled to God, that 552 we know when we have gone astray, and

it's it's a plea from us to
554
      God to bring us back on the right track,
555
      because we always want to be ready in
556
      season and out of season. And we don't
557
      want to be in a position where we
558
      have to make apologies for
559
      what we believe. Like, well, you know,
560
      you say that we shouldn't do this, but I
561
      know you're doing this over here. No.
562
      We need to examine our lives, and
563
      therefore we are ready to
564
      tell people about Jesus in season
565
      and out of season, not always
566
      easy, not always easy.
567
      And that's one of the reasons why we come
568
      to church, because we have we have
569
      this fellowship. We We
570
      talk to each other. We build each other
571
    up. We We bear one another's
572
     burdens. This is what a church
573
      does. And this is why I love
574
      it here, is because we have
575
      people that are not -- we have people that
576
      are not continually putting me down,
577
      although you have good reason to.
578
      We stand together, we stand united for
      Christ, and we must always do
579
580
      that. So what we get out of
581
      our scripture reading this morning
582
      is that we are to be ready to give an
583
      accounting for our faith. And in
584
      doing so, we are to be prepared to
      do it. And we're prepared to do it as we
585
586
      worship the Lord, as we confess our
587
      sins, we're prepared to do it as we study
588
      scripture, We're prepared to do it
589
      as we we come together and and
590
      in fellowship, and we we tell each
591
      other how much we love each other. That's
592
      important, you know, is to tell each
593
      other how much we love each other. We're
594
      to always be ready to do this. We're
595
      always to be prepared. We're
596
      always to be ready to give an account of
597
      our faith in season and out of
598
      season, and the season is
599
      now. Let's pray.
600
      Lord Jesus, we come before you
601
      knowing that you have commissioned us to
602
      go out into the world and tell others the
603
      good news. We pray that as we do
604
      so, it will be received as good
605
     news. We know that some of us will have
606
      to suffer in various ways for our faith.
607
      We'll be turned away by our families, by
608
      our friends. We know that
609
      the world out theredoes not
610
      give its allegiance to you, but we do
611
      give our allegiance to you. And we pray
      that you would build us up and make us
612
613
      your people, now and forever.
614
      And we pray this, dear Jesus, in your
615
      name, in Jesus' name,
616
      amen. And now as we prepare
617
      for communion, because
618
     this is Communion Sunday, let's
    stand and together sing our hymn of

      preparation number 465,

      Marvelous grace of our loving God, Lord.
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
