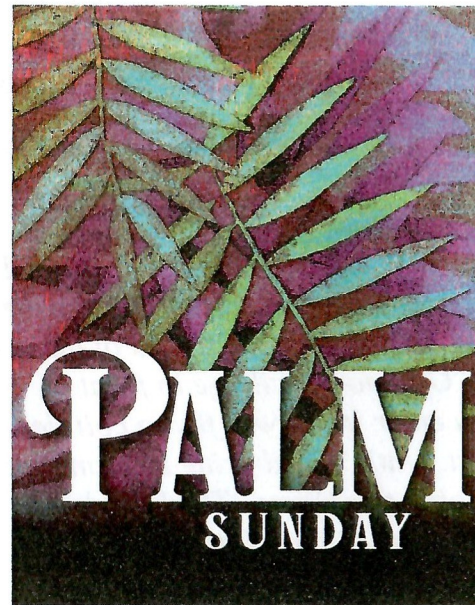


Rahab: The Unexpected

*Let us weigh the gain and the loss in wagering that God is.
Let us estimate these two chances. If you gain, you gain all; if you lose,
you lose nothing. Wager, then, without hesitation that He is.
"That is very fine. Yes, I must wager; but I may perhaps wager
too much." Let us see. Since there is an equal risk of gain
and loss, if you had only to gain two lives, instead of one, you
might still wager... But there is here an infinity of an infinitely
happy life to gain, a chance of gain against a finite number of
chances of loss, and what you stake is finite. It is all divided;
where-ever the infinite is and there is not an infinity of chances of loss against that of gain, there is no
time to hesitate, you must give all.*
